





PACT - Placement Advisory Counselling Team is a specially designed method where "The 3 Member PACT Team" worked as a UNIT by owning a particular section/s allocated to it to conduct weekly one session covering all aspects of placement preparation.

One of the very distinguished activities named "KYS-Know your student" plays a very critical role in identifying student interest areas, their training needs and assessing their place ability. KYS is conducted 3 times first before the commencement of placement season, during the placement cycle and lastly in the 2nd phase of the placement cycle.

Also, one of the very important points in this aspect is to take timely and continuous feedback from the recruiters and corporate delegates on "what kind of talent they want or are required". And accordingly including that feedback into placement training. Recruiters' feedback helps the placement department to set up the tone of KYS and in turn are exercised in PACT Sessions.

We have proven examples of our approach toward placements: Students are taking fewer companies to get placed. Earlier the average company's students used to participate to get placed was around 6-7, after this approach, it came down to 2-3 companies, which is a clear indication that students are transforming on all required parameters of placements & recruiter's requirement.

Also, Students develop a sense of responsibility and accountability on themselves toward placement preparation. This is a good indication as they are not taking placements for granted.
















STUDENT'S ARTICLES ON THEIR IBS-AHMEDABAD JOURNEY

Far from home...

Pliny the Elder's famous quote "Home is Where the Heart is" captures the essence of living in today's fast-paced world, where living with one's family is a privilege. Around the globe, especially in Eastern countries, the youth is usually conditioned to move out of their homes when they turn eighteen. However, in a South Asian country like ours, the tradition is to live with our parents, grandparents, and extended families, all under the same roof. With the advent of modernization, the family structure has changed across the country and with time, the children of the family started moving out of their homes, leaving their comfort spaces, to attain higher education or earn a livelihood.

On completing my schooling in Kolkata, West Bengal, which is my hometown, I further had the luxury to complete my graduation from the warmth of my home. Soon after completing my Bachelors in Engineering, I commenced my post-graduation, i.e., Master of Business Administration (MBA), for which I had to move to the other end of the country- Ahmedabad, Gujarat.




