

#### Understanding and Managing Emotional Triggers

term 'emotional trigger' describes sensations, thoughts, and situations that cause a person to react emotionally - automatically. Because the reaction happens automatically and without much self-control, the word 'trigger' is crucial. Despite appearing to be involuntary, the reaction, like everything else we do, is a matter of choice. We must learn to recognise our own emotional triggers if we want to take control of how we react to situations. # Reminiscence of a town – Bijbehara (Management lessons from my experience in Kashmir)

Bijbehara!!! I first heard the name of the town in the early 90s, when the Kashmir conflict was new. There was a militant behind every tree and an improvised explosive device (IED) under every stone. There was a demonstration against India and some miscreants taking advantage of the situation had tried to snatch an army officer's weapon. He opened fire and many miscreants were killed. The human rights lobby created a huge ruckus over the issue.

In 2003 when I was in the army, I got posted to Kashmir. On 24th September 2003, our convoy headed towards Srinagar. While crossing Bijbehara I remembered hearing the name many years ago. My musing was interrupted by a loud blast. A scooter based IED, with 5 Kg of explosives, kept at the roadside, with a clear aim of targeting our convoy, had exploded. The person detonating it had miscalculated the time. Also, because the road was wide and our vehicle was in the center meant that the explosion had occurred at a considerable distance and no damage was caused to us. The IED had been very powerful and we felt the vibrations inside the vehicle. Some locals standing near the road were not so lucky. They bore the brunt of the blast and five of them were killed. Our vehicles sped ahead and stopped only when we were well out of the village. We assessed the damage done. Luckily no one was injured. One of the officers on the convoy jokingly said to the others, "Welcome to Kashmir guys." (Yes, army men can find humor and crack a joke in any situation.)

(Management lesson - EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED - When venturing into the unknown, in life or in business, always be ready for the worst. You may have heard tales of what others encountered but facing it yourself is so different. Be mentally prepared for the worst at any time. Also, the best way to avoid any damage / loss is to follow the best practices and have situational awareness. Always be alert to your surroundings at all times. Make an effort to know the people you work with and the situation that you work in). This was not to be my last brush with Bijbehara. A few months later, I was doing convoy protection duties. The convoy route passed through many towns including Bijbehara. One day when everything was going on as usual and we were passing through Bijbehara, there was a loud thud on the window of my vehicle followed by an explosion. The thud had been a grenade hitting the window pane. The window pane had been rolled up and the grenade had not come into the vehicle. It exploded on the road. The local unit swung into action and neutralized the grenade thrower.

(Management lesson - FOLLOW THE PROCEDURES - In the first instance, the driver driving our vehicle in the middle of the road was a standard operating procedure (SOP). In this case, the window being rolled up was the same, an SOP. These SOPs have been developed over a period of time based on the experience of people and in this case they saved lives including my own life. Follow the procedures whenever and wherever they are applicable. There is a reason they exist. If you feel some procedure is unnecessary or outdated, find out the reason it was started in the first place. If the reason is no longer valid, amend it by all means.)

If I thought that this was the last memory that the town would give me, I was mistaken. A month later I was on the same route and the same duty and of course passing through the same town. There was a burst of AK 47 from a nearby building. The vehicle in front of us was hit and so was the vehicle that I was sitting in. The soldier sitting on the vehicle with a light machine gun (LMG) retaliated and caused the militants to duck for cover. The convoy sped out of the town to a safe place.

(Management lesson - YOUR RIVAL WILL TRY ANYTHING AND EVERYTHING - Do not write off your rivals in life or business. They watch you, they learn and adapt. If one thing fails, they will surely try something else. Always be alert. Likewise, you too should watch, learn and adapt at all times.)

Over the next few months, I passed through the town many more times and each time I would be in a very high state of alert lest the town sprang more surprises for me. (An IED, a grenade and AK 47 — what next?) Even now whenever I hear the name of the town, I cannot help but get a sense of almost being back there. You cannot just stop thinking of a place where you had such narrow brushes with death.

In 2005 when I left the army and headed home, as I passed through Bijbehara, I was expecting something to happen. Guess what? Nothing happened. For a town that had given me such a 'warm' welcome, the farewell was very quiet.

(Management lesson - DO NOT BE PARANOID - As a leader, being paranoid will only cause you to feel stressed out. While being alert is one thing, it should not develop into unnecessary fear and distract you from your work / objectives.) It has been many years since I last passed through Bijbehara. Over the years, the Kashmir conflict has taken many twists and turns. It looks like we will finally see the end of the troubles. I plan to visit the state as a tourist and go to places like Gulmarg, Dal Lake and many other well-known tourist destinations. I think I should also pay a visit to Bijbehara. Or should I?

#### Global Gains for India despite the Global Turmoil

### De-Dollarisation: A Long Way to Go!

In recent times, the term de-dollarisation started gaining momentum when India and China decided to do trade with countries in their own currencies. Also, the RBI has given permission to various banks from 18 countries to open Special Vostro Rupee Accounts (SVRA) to facilitate transactions in rupees. In recent months, the Unified Payments Interface (UPI), one of India's digital payment systems, has seen a steady rise in adoption on a worldwide scale. Additionally, India's growing economic ties with China and Russia have an impact on its desire to de-dollarize. India is one of the top buyers of Russia's crude oil, and the two nations have been attempting to expand their trading relations in other areas as well. China and India have increased their economic cooperation in recent years, achieving \$100 billion in bilateral commerce between the two nations in 2022. In light of these developments, it is not a surprise that India is actively looking at Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunication (SWIFT) alternatives and attempting to strengthen its commercial links with China and Russia. Additionally, the BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa) group is considering creating a new reserve currency based on a basket of the

participating countries' currencies. It will take several years for any currency to seriously contend with the US dollar's hegemony since the de-dollarization process is not an easy one. Currently, more than 58% of the world's foreign exchange reserves are held in US dollars. Currently, only 1.6% of the daily average of all international trade is transacted in Indian rupees whereas it was only 0.6% in 2007. The US would experience greater import costs and more volatility in the global commodities markets as more nations move to other currencies for commodity transactions, which might impair the development and stability of the US economy. De-dollarization is ultimately a difficult and drawn-out process, but the trend is obvious and indisputable. Although it will take time, the dollar might eventually lose its dominance as the world's primary medium of exchange, and India will have spearheaded the movement!

The paper's title is "An Empirical Analysis of the Factors affecting Gold Prices". The Abstract

Gold has been one of the most loved metals by humans since it was found. There are multiple reasons for that but the biggest reason is that it can be easily converted into cash.

Gold has been one of the important pillars of the Indian economy since its inception. It is the best investment for the common people. At the present time also, it is used by investors as an instrument to hedge their portfolio investment. The monetary demand for gold has been on roll during the last few decades as people use to carry it or wear it in form of jewellery. Even today majority of the countries use gold during international trade. It has been observed that countries that have large gold backing to their currency help their currency to become internationally acceptable and more powerful. Example – USA. But gold prices have been continuously rising for the last few decades and still, it is rising.

The price of 10 grams of 24k gold in January 2013 was Rs 29909/- which increased to Rs 57709/- in December 2022. The gold price during the last decade has increased by more than 50%. What

could be the reason behind that? This paper tries to find some answers to the question.

This research paper tries to find the important factors which lead to the historical rise in the price of gold and also find factors that are highly responsible for the change. The major factors that are considered for the study are exchange rates, crude oil, silver, and nifty50 which impacts the changes in the price of gold. The data was collected from the year 2013 to 2022. Multiple regression analysis is used for drawing conclusions.
