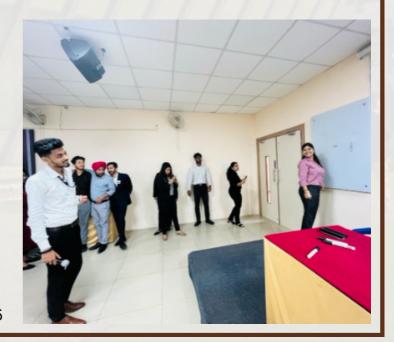

Selected research papers have been compiled and edited as Conference Proceedings with ISBN number and published by Success Publishers.
