To do this, organisations need to ensure their business strategy consolidation, crisis management, disaster recovery, and risk management in order to modify and get back on track with true business efforts.

Students' Innovation in Operations Management: IT, NON-IT, or Apps' was organized at the national level on September 18th, 2021, where students from various colleges came up with ideas in a report and were shortlisted by our club mentors to present them in front of our external judges, Mr. Kaustabh Tiperneni (Senior Industrial Engineer, Geodis, Sparks, USA) and Mr. Sandeep Chatterjee (Director, Deloitte and CEO, ISCEA India).

The Winning Team received two Global Certification Courses for Lean Six Sigma Green Belt (CLSSGB) from ISCEA SCNext worth Rs. 22,500/-each and a cash prize of Rs. 5,000/- for the winner Rs. 3,000/-for the 1st runner-up and Rs. 2,000/-for the 2nd runner-up The winner of the event was from NIE, Mysore, 1st Runner up from LPU, Punjab and 2nd Runner up from XIMB, Bhubaneswar.

The female members of the Operations Club successfully arranged and managed the event "Women's League" on October 23rd, 2021. The purpose of holding this event was to emphasize the individuality of women, and it was judged by two female faculty members, Dr. Deeppa K and Prof. Spurti Sushil.

The most interesting event organized by the club for ZEAL ESPERANZA 2k21, the annual management fest of ICFAI Business School, PUNE, was "Squid JAG-EOB," which was themed on the popular Korean web series "Squid Games." It was successfully conducted on November 20th, 2021, on the second day of the fest. The game was played in three rounds by two-person teams. Each round was a round of elimination. The first round was "Honeycomb," in which the participants had to choose a shape and then solve a puzzle. The second round, "Red Light, Green Light," was a form of the atlas in which teams were given a category and a letter and had to offer a one-word answer connected to that under a time constraint. Every year, the club invites Armed Forces Veterans to pay tribute to martyrs who gave their precious lives during the 1971 war. This year, the club invited Col. Ramgopal, Col. Sunil Brijkrishan, Major Gen. MSS Krishnan, and Col. Misar Gundagi to share their experiences and opinions with the students of IBS Pune on Vijay Diwas.

Last but not least, the club organized a pleasant event called "Tick Tick Think" on January 11, 2021, to let participants close the year with less stress and more of a fun game after a long year of homework and class routines. 
The speakers imparted to the students some valuable life lessons.


At the end of the first round, four qualifiers were declared. The qualifiers were as follows:

Shubham Kamble: IBS Pune Bishwajita Das: IBS Pune Himanshu Singh: IBS Pune





Our club is one of the college's renowned clubs, with many more events planned in the future. Join us and be a part of our wonderful journey.











Along with PACT, Soft skills sessions also helped us polish our skills, whether it be written or verbal communication, body language, or listening skills. Later in the coming semesters, we were trained with practical sessions discussing placement etiquettes, different placement processes, GD topics, and PI questions. We have experienced the process of multiple GDs and PIs by participating and observing them and also improved ourselves by listening to the guidance given to everyone after each GD or PI. Being attentive during all these times resulted in a fruitful experience for me.

Pointers that helped me grab my placement opportunity:

- Take PACT and Soft skills sessions seriously
- Focus on your goals, set targets to achieve them and work hard for them
- Stay in touch with all faculty members and take proper advice from them
- Upgrade yourself theoretically as well as practically
- Note down things you observe and learn in your day-to-day life
- Overcome your weaknesses and use your strengths in the best way
- Don't underestimate or overestimate yourself
